WEB OF MURDER

The first show of the new season for the Stone Arch Players will be WEB OF MURDER by Jonathan Troy. This comedy/murder mystery is directed by Madam Prez Thiry Olbrich and features an all-star cast.

WEB OF MURDER takes place in a remote mansion high on a cliff overlooking the Pacific Ocean, owned by eccentric invalid, Minerva Osterman. The rich woman has invited her extended family to the decaying home for a pre-death reading of her will, but the weekend turns out to be anything but ordinary, when, under a hypnotic trance, she predicts the deaths of three of the assembled company. Murderous mayhem ensues.

Starring as Minerva Osterman is Linda Swartz, who has been in many Thiry Olbrich productions, beginning with THE SOLID GOLD CADILLAC. Jill Harbst Boulanger (WHO'S IN BED WITH THE BUTLER?) plays the eccentric's stay-at-home daughter, Stephanie, and Barb Stahl (BORN YESTERDAY) is the housekeeper, Nora. A double dose of romance seasons the show, as the old woman's two nieces both arrive with fiancés in tow. Niece One, Mary, is played by newcomer Regina Shawver. Welcome, Regina! Mary's straight-arrow fiancé is favorite action hero Rob Burns (SUITE SURRENDER). Niece Two, Belle, is portrayed by Rachel Jones (THE PSYCHIC) with her fiancé, con-man Pete, played by Zachariah Smith. Smith appeared with us 11 years ago as the grandson in OVER THE RIVER AND THROUGH THE WOODS. Bill Daup plays strange hypnotist, Dr. Adler, and Dick Jones is "The Man." Both appeared last year in BORN YESTERDAY.

WEB OF MURDER will premier at the Theatre In The Park on November eighth and continue through November 24th. Patron tickets will go on sale two weeks prior to the opening and for the general public one week prior. Mark your calendars now for the Stone Arch Players' first entry in their upcoming gala "Year of Mystery"!
