SEASON OPENING WILL BE MURDER!

The Stone Arch Players' first offering of the season will be the classic drama DIAL M FOR MURDER. Our group's president, Thiry Olbrich, will direct the show, assisted by Susan Turns and Teresa Williams.

The play and screenplay were written by English playwright Frederick Knott, whose work often focused on women who innocently become the victims of sinister plots. It originally premiered in 1952 on BBC television, before moving to the stage in the same year. In 1954, Alfred Hitchcock directed the movie version starring Ray Milland, Grace Kelly, and Robert Cummings. In June 2008, the American Film Institute revealed its "Ten Top Ten"—the best ten films in ten "classic" American film genres—after polling over 1,500 people from the creative community. DIAL M FOR MURDER was ranked the ninth best film in the mystery genre in the list. A PERFECT MURDER is a 1998 remake starring Michael Douglas and Gwyneth Paltrow in which several characters are combined. In this version, the wife solves the mystery rather than the police inspector.

DIALM FOR MURDER is chock-ful of SAP stars, leading off with Rob Burns as Tony Wendice, the duplicitous husband. Burns has been a member of our organization for some years and most recently appeared in the mutiroled, tour-de-farce GREATER TUNA, two summers ago. Last seen here in THE UNEXPECTED GUEST, Chris Brannen plays the wife's paramour. Brannen appeared in both WONDERFUL TOWN and HELLO DOLLY this summer at the Boal Barn. The two actors also portrayed brothers in 2007's SABRINA FAIR.

Ladies' favorite Mark Casamento, who debuted with us as loveable younger brother Jimmy in 2006's THE RAINMAKER, is cast against type in DIAL M, as the sleazy murderer-for hire and friend of the scheming husband. Rounding off the male portion of the cast, Andy McCartle (DEARLY BELOVED) and Devin Varner (CHARLEY'S AUNT) play the policemen.

Starring as the tormented and harassed heroine of this classic murder mystery is new member Regina Brannen. Brannen is a well known actress with the State College Community Theatre and favorite roles include Gypsy Rose Lee in GYPSY, Sally Bowles in CABARET, and Maggie in CAT ON A HOT TIN ROOF. Recent performances include a hilarious 2008 turn as Sister Robert Anne in SCCT's NUNSENSE. She is married to Chris Brannen's brother Patrick, has five beautiful children, is a marathon runner, owns and operates the children's store SPELA, and is an avid Facebooker. Welcome, Regina!

DIAL M FOR MURDER opens Friday, November fifth and runs for three weekends. Please note this change in schedule: Sunday matinees will be the first and second weekends: November 7 and 14. There will be no Sunday matinee the final weekend of the show.

DIAL M FOR MURDER promises to be a treat for all fans of murder mysteries and domestic drama, filled with the Olbrichian touches we've come to expect from our premier director. Will the greedy and straying husband frame his wife for the murder of a man he'd hired to kill her? Join us in November to find out!

The Stone Arch Players are pleased to announce their 2010/2011 season at the Theatre In The Park. Starting off the theatrical year will be Frederick Knott's classic murder mystery DIAL M FOR MURDER, directed by Thiry Olbrich. Founder and long-term president, Olbrich recently directed both LAURA and THE UNEXPECTED GUEST, other chilling murder mysteries. A husband's nefarious and twisted plot against his maybe-not-so-innocent wife fuels the plot of this classic thriller.

Neil Simon's RUMORS takes second spot in our line-up. In our special repeat offering this year, Veep Phyllis Johnson redirects her 1995 hit with the hopes that it will retickle your funny bone as much as it did fifteen years ago. An upper class dinner party is derailed by . . . what else? RUMORS! And rumors, aplenty. How many of the original cast members will reappear in this hilarious retread? Only time and the next edition of this newsletter will tell. RUMORS reruns from Feb 25 to March 13.

Our final main stage production for the season is LOSING PATIENTS by A. Duke and Virginia Cate, and directed by Secretary Alan Peoples.
