

WILLIAM GILLETTE

SAP's latest In production, THE GAME'S AFOOT OR HOLMES FOR THE HOLIDAYS, Michael Cramer brings to life William Gillette, the legendary actor, director, playwright, novelist and inventor. Born in 1853 in Hartford, Connecticut, Gillette discovered his love of theater at an early age and by the time he was thirty he had become one of the premier "matinee idols" in America,

becoming famous across the country for his minimalist acting style onstage and theatrical innovations off. However, in 1899 Gillette found worldwide fame when he worked with Sir Arthur Conan Doyle to bring Sherlock Holmes to the stage. Gillette had free reign to recreate the famous detective, making him less of "a machine rather than a man", and many of Gillette's additions to the character (like Holmes' curved pipe) have become a permanent part of Holmes' iconic image. Gillette's Holmes play was a runaway hit in the United States and in 1901 Gillette became the first American actor to be invited to perform on the British stage. He went on to perform the show over 1,300 times, as well as playing Holmes in movies and on the radio. Gillette continued to act (as Holmes, as well as in many other shows) until his death in 1937. The elaborate castle Gillette designed and lived in- the setting of THE GAME'S AFOOT- still stands in East Haddam, Connecticut where it has become a state park and one of the top three tourist attractions in the state.
